A Durham Education



A Durham education is one that inspires, nurtures and encourages its students through the provision of the finest quality teaching coupled with extensive opportunities to enable our students to achieve. Our excellent teachers encourage students to think creatively, to apply knowledge and skills successfully and imaginatively, and to constantly challenge themselves whilst building 'Confidence for Life' in a positive and supportive environment.

Durham School Dubai is committed to delivering an education that is engaging, challenging, motivating and fun. Using a holistic and rigorous approach to education, our students learn through stimulating and creative experiences, in the classroom and beyond, in lessons and co-curricular activities. We aim to ensure that every Durham student's experience of school is positive and productive laying the foundation for academic success.



Early Years Foundation Stage

The Foundation Stage is a two-year phase for our youngest children and caters for children aged between three and five years old.

Teaching assistants support the class teachers so that all children are closely guided and supported by trained adults in small groups, and there is also input from specialist teachers in subjects such as languages and physical education.

The Early Years is a delightful introduction to school filled with exciting learning opportunities. Early Years curriculum is a play-based curriculum with carefully planned activities enabling children to learn whilst having fun. Our classrooms all open into outdoor areas that are organised to allow children to explore and learn securely and safely.

The curriculum is broken down into seven areas:

- Personal, social and emotional development
- Communication and language
- Physical development
- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding the world
- Expressive arts and design

In teaching younger children, we work closely with parents to really get to know and understand every child in our care.



Primary School

Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2

Key Stage 1 covers pupils in Year 1 and Year 2 (5 – 7 years old) and Key Stage 2 covers pupils from Year 3 to Year 6 (8 to 11 years old).

In Key Stage 1, children are introduced to more formal lessons however, there is still a lot of learning through play, especially in Year 1. In Key Stage 1, it is essential that children are given a good grounding in the basics and we concentrate heavily on the teaching of reading including a daily phonics programme, developing writing skills and vocabulary and increasing familiarity and confidence with number. Additionally, children will also start to study science, Arabic language and Islamic education, history, geography, design technology, music, art, PE and swimming. Links across curriculum subjects are made wherever possible and all activities are planned and delivered to maximise first-hand experience with teachers responding to the children's differing learning styles.

In Key Stage 2, learning becomes more formal and children continue to read each day as well as having daily English and mathematics lessons. In some curriculum areas, the Key Stage 2 timetable runs in parallel with the secondary school timetable allowing more specialist teaching in Year 5 and Year 6.

At Key Stage 2, the core subjects of English, mathematics and science form the spine of the curriculum with history, geography and computing being taught in greater depth. Art, music, physical education, swimming and games promote the children's sporting and creative development and all children will learn Arabic language. Muslim students will study Islamic education and Emirati social studies.



Key Stage 3 and Key Stage 4

Our bespoke Key Stage 3 curriculum covers pupils from Year 7 – Year 9 (ages 12 – 14). Lessons are designed to develop and deepen pupils understanding of the subjects in preparation for them to make choices as to subjects they will study at Key Stage 4. In Key Stage 3 and Key Stage 4, subjects are taught by a specialist subject teacher with the pupils moving from room to room. The pupil's pastoral welfare is overseen by their form tutor assisted by their head of house.

Key Stage 4 includes Year 10 and Year 11 (ages 15 and 16). Here pupils have a choice of stimulating and challenging subjects to study for their IGCSE examinations at the end of Year 11. Alongside pupils' chosen subjects, all pupils will continue to study, mathematics, English and the sciences. Our secondary school pupils will be given a great deal of time and individual attention including developing the self-discipline, time management and study skills to ensure that they perform well in their IGCSE examinations.



Sixth Form

Our Sixth Form provision is for pupils, aged 17 and 18 (Years 12 and 13). In the Sixth Form, pupils will study for A-level examinations, specialising in subjects of particular interest to them. In most cases, pupils will work towards examinations in three, or sometimes four, subjects. Specialist staff will work with pupils to ensure that they obtain the best possible grades to enable them to access universities of their choice. Pupils will also receive support for the university applications through a dedicated support team that have experience in placing students in universities in the UAE, the UK, the United States, Asia and Europe.

Leadership skills, community projects and service are all important aspects of our Sixth Form education. Whilst academic achievement is extremely important, so to our social skills and social competence. Our pupils will be given plenty of opportunities to develop and extend themselves through a range of activities and a comprehensive extracurricular programme.



Arabic Language and Islamic Education



The teaching of Arabic language for both native and non-native speakers, Islamic education for our Muslim students and Social Studies and Moral Education are all a part of our core curriculum. These subjects will be taught as directed by the Ministry of Education and our students will follow the Ministry approved syllabus in each component. We believe that high quality teaching results in the best learning outcomes for our students and we are determined that these subjects will be taught to the highest standards encouraging learning and enjoyment and a pride in Emirati roots and culture.

Arabic Language

Arabic as a first language promotes the development of Arabic in accordance with UAE Ministry of Education expectations. From a young age, our pupils develop their native language skills through speaking, listening, reading, writing, and grammar. Pupils in Key Stage 2 and Key Stage 3 will have specialist Arabic lessons four times in a week.

At Durham School Dubai we consider the teaching of Arabic to non-native speakers to be most important. Our teachers draw upon best practice in the development and acquisition of modern foreign languages. Our pupils learn Arabic through the development of four key skills: speaking, listening, reading and writing. Pupils in Key Stage 2 and Key Stage 3 will have specialist Arabic lessons four times in a week.



Arabic Language and Islamic Education (cont.)

Islamic Education

Our Muslim students in Primary School and Key Stage 3 will attend specialist Islamic Education lessons twice a week. The curriculum provides helps the students to develop their understanding of their religion, values and beliefs.

Social Studies

In Social Studies, the students will follow the Ministry of Education Curriculum. They will learn about their culture, national identity and UAE citizenship helping them develop a sense of belonging and pride in their country and heritage. Social Studies In Social Studies, the students will follow the Ministry of Education Curriculum. Moral Education

The Moral Education Curriculum is divided into four core areas:

- The Character and Morality curriculum which supports the Durham values and develops honest, tolerant, resilient, kind individuals.
- The Individual and the Community Curriculum helps our students understand about contributing to the good of society, participating actively and leading others to strive to make things better.
- Civil Studies ensures that whether a student is an Emirati, born in the UAE, or an expat who moved here with their family, they understand and appreciate the fundamentals of how the UAE was formed and how it is governed.
- Culture is an inherent part of a society and the programme highlights UAE's shared human culture that encapsulates the traditions and symbols that help define who we are.



Co-Curricular Activities

Durham School Dubai believes in a rounded education and we encourage her pupils to participate in an extensive co-curricular programme that includes sporting, artistic, academic, and musical opportunities. We believe that co-curricular opportunities enrich and develop the individual, fostering skills such as leadership, collaboration and teamwork.

A comprehensive programme of sporting activities is available to all pupils starting from the youngest children and continuing right through the school. The school runs a number of sports teams in the major sports and Durham pupils compete against other schools in Dubai. In addition, there are internal sports competitions through the house system that allow all pupils to represent their house in competitive events. We appreciate that not all children want to compete, and so recreational sporting opportunities are available for those who wish to participate simply for the enjoyment.



Music, Art and Drama, alongside other creative subjects are extremely important in a Durham education. We strongly believe in encouraging pupils' creativity. Musical opportunities include choirs, peripatetic music lessons and small bands, whilst art and drama, give opportunities for pupils to be involved in the production of plays, both acting and backstage as well as public speaking. All pupils regularly perform for their peers and for parents at our school assemblies.



Our co-curricular programme also gives pupils' opportunities to develop their academic interests. Activities, such as science clubs, literary appreciation, language clubs, various STEM (Science, technology, engineering, and mathematics) activities, chess and board games ensure that there is something for everyone at Durham School Dubai.









